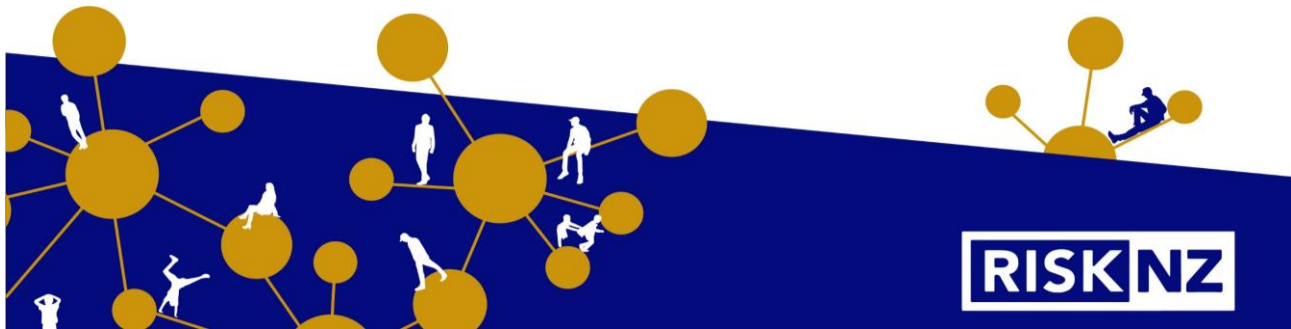

<p>1. Risk Professional of the Year</p>	<p>This category is open to RiskNZ members only. *note this is an individual award <i>(an Individual Member or listed as part of an existing Corporate Membership)</i>.</p> <p>Entrants should demonstrate their sustained risk leadership and their contribution in making a significant difference to their organisation, clients, or the wider risk management community/industry. Entrants will show mature practice in supporting teams to better manage risk and to achieve business goals. They will have the competence and mana to work with and influence at an executive or governance level.</p> <p>The judges are looking for evidence of the individual’s effective risk management leadership; strategic and operational thinking; excellent communication skills, the ability to demonstrate positive impacts, while also being respected by their peers.</p> <p><u>Applicants should additionally submit a summary CV</u> as supporting information showcasing highlights from their risk management career.</p>
<p>2. Emerging Risk Professional of the Year</p>	<p>This category is open to RiskNZ members only. *note this is an individual award <i>(an Individual Member or listed as part of an existing Corporate Membership)</i>.</p> <p>Entrants in this category should be relatively new to a career in organisational risk management and must have worked in a risk related role for less than five (as at 1 January 2021).</p> <p>The judges are looking for individuals that can demonstrate that they have contributed to the measurement, management and/or mitigation of risk within their organisation over the last 18 months. Judges will be seeking evidence of strong organisation; planning; negotiating and influencing, and communication skills which are all important attributes of an aspiring risk manager. Successful entrants will be able to provide evidence of one or more of these.</p> <p><u>Applicants should additionally submit a summary CV</u> as supporting information, illustrating progression within their risk management career.</p>
<p>3. Networking and Partnerships in Risk Management</p>	<p>This category is open to RiskNZ members and non-members. Entrants in this category can be an individual, team or organisation.</p> <p>The judges are looking for entrants that can demonstrate how collaboration across teams or organisations can effectively manage risk, strengthen strategic delivery and deliver results. This award will be shared across those teams or organisations and provides an excellent opportunity to demonstrate strategic advantage in partnerships.</p>
<p>4. Developing Capability in Risk Management</p>	<p>This category is open to RiskNZ members and non-members. Entrants in this category can be an individual, team or organisation.</p> <p>The judges are looking for entrants that can demonstrate how the effective communication of risk thinking or practice results in building organisational strength in risk management capability. Entrants will be able to show how non-risk professionals integrate effective risk management approaches within normal business practice.</p>
<p>5. “Cov-innovation” – Managing risk during times of significant change.</p>	<p>This award is open to RiskNZ members and non-members. Entrants in this category can be an individual, team or organisation.</p> <p>This award recognises and celebrates innovative practices or approaches implemented during Covid-19, that ensured risk identified during a period of significant disruption was effectively managed. It’s likely this innovation has translated into ongoing business practice for your organisation or your client, and is continuing to demonstrate value, adaptability and business stability.</p> <p>Whilst benefits may not be full realised yet, the promise is there and you’re excited to share what this could become for your organisation.</p>
<p>6. Governance and Leadership in Risk Management</p>	<p>This category is open to RiskNZ members and non-members. Entrants in this category can be an individual, team or organisation.</p> <p>This award showcases how risk management approaches have been embedded at an executive and governance level. More than just reporting, this category celebrates approaches that enable nimble decision-making by governance entities that strengthens business performance.</p> <p>The judges are looking for nominations from organisations that can demonstrate a commitment to ongoing contextual awareness; enhancing organisational risk practice; and embedding good decision making as part of normal business process. At least one reference needs to come from a Board Chair or Executive leader.</p>

- (1) The Problem Statement / Issue / Opportunity;
- (2) The Solution;
- (3) The Benefit and Value; and
- (4) Your Reference.

Please outline below in 1500 words or less, why the nominee deserves to win the award. Please feel free to attach additional documents to support your nomination (max four pages).

Background - (Your current role within your organisation and any relevant background information)

(1) – Problem statement / issue / opportunity (20% weighting).

This section describes your understanding of the key business problems or risk management challenges faced by your organisation (or team, or client).

(2) The Solution (40% weighting).

This section outlines the steps or approach taken by you/your team to solve the problem and embed the solution as part of ongoing cultural practice. This should reference any outputs developed, and how they have been used.

(3) - Benefit and value (30% weighting)

This section describes how the solution has added measurable benefit or value for you, your team or your organisation. Describe the role that the solution now plays in supporting good decision making that manages risk and enables delivery of business goals.

(4) - References (10% weighting):

This section includes 2 written references that provide evidence for the nomination, and why it should be considered for the Award category.
